## General Information about the Thirst Project:

### When did Thirst Project start?

The Thirst Project began 7 years ago, when 7 students living in Los Angeles, California went on the streets and started talking to people about the Global Water Crisis. Through 2 local Los Angeles, California high school presentations, 2 high schools raised \$12,000 and through that process the Thirst Project was born.

### What does the Thirst Project do?

The Thirst Project does **two main things**:


1. They build freshwater wells in developing countries.
2. They educate and activate students through our national school tour about the global water crisis.

### Why is the main demographic teenagers?,

Students are the most powerful agents of social change. The Thirst Project is looking for the *biggest shift in change* the world has ever seen. Pushing the water crisis into the history books.
