- These 3 themes will then be brought to each Lt. Governor's respective division and the Lt. Governor will vote online as a representative of the division
- The result will remain secret until Fall Rally

3:14pm: Board members reconvene and begin committee reports.

- Member Services
 - Chairwoman Baohan discusses three goals:

 - 2. Break 15,000 members in Capital District by January.

- Fall Rally Chair Lt. Governor Sara Morin explains additional signs and balloons pointing to the initial meeting room at Kings Dominion, and Minute-to-Win-It games for prizes.
- DCON Chairs Christine and Sophia reveal the 5 DCON themes to decide upon.
 - 1. Dr. Seuss "Oh the Places Service Will Go," Crabby in the Hat, Book Drive, Thing 1/Thing 2 competition.
 - 2. Music "Jammin' Service," incorporate "Decades" theme and talent shows.
 - 3. Mythology Greek mythology, togas, Greek Coliseum, Olympics, Crabby with a toga and olive leaf wreath.
 - 4. Travel "Go the Distance with Service"/"Oh the Places You'll Go with Service," Crabby as a tacky tourist, focused on transportation rather than destinations, flyers could be passports/plane tickets.
 - 5. Decades "Timeless Service," Clothes Drive, Crabby with a watch or clock

4:18pm: DCON Chairs Christine and Sophia open discussion on the possible themes, whereby board members may only speak once on each theme.

- Decades:
 - Editor Bianca: broad theme for costume ideas; could be like the ICON 2015 Kiwanis session with time machine
 - Lt. Governor Sara Morin: more versatile than having a specific decade
 - Lt. Governor Reed Lundegard: theme is rather vague and members may not be on the same page
- Travel:

- o Lt. Governor Emma Stone: "I ♥ Capital District" t-shirts
- Lt. Governor Kaila Blevins: unsure about what decorations would be
- LT. Governor Michael Bell: "I [Crabby] Cap DCON" t-shirts
- Lt. Governor Kyle Enriquez: promotional video could have Crabby traveling in a plane

Mythology:

- Lt. Governor Jake Clark: togas will be allowed only with shirts underneath
- Service Partner Liaison Emily: bedsheets cannot be used so it might be a hassle
- Lt. Governor Vicky Nguyen: everyone has bedsheets so everyone can participate
- Lt. Governor Danny Inglis: there might not be a variety of costumes
- Lt. Governor Kyle Enriquez: there can be different colored bedsheets
- Editor Bianca: a cohesive theme that can be worked into the program with good decorations and references

Music:

- Lt. Governor Jessica Brown: incorporate decades and music into it with many possible artists
- Lt. Governor Emily Mussey: possibly narrow the theme down so it is not just music
- o Lt. Governor Danny Inglis: theme appeals to everyone
- Lt. Governor Emma Stone: doesn't have to be a specific artist;
 you can dress up as a genre
- o Lt. Governor Reed Lundegard: limited costumes

• Dr. Seuss:

- Lt. Governor Rebecca DeVore: people can go all out
- DCON Chair Sophia: decorations, speeches, costumes, t-shirt, slogan, can all incorporate this theme
- Lt. Governor Reed Lundegard: Dr. Seuss books have positive messages
- Lt. Governor Kyle Enriquez: possibly expand the theme to a general "storybook" theme
- Lt. Governor Kaila Blevins: too whimsical; no easily accessible costumes
- Lt. Governor Michael Bell: difficult to create authentic costumes rather than purchasing them; limited costumes online
- Lt. Governor Shinbee Park: not much variety of costumes, but good for decorations
